
Welcome back for the start of Term 1! From all of us on the Year 4 team, we hope you had a lovely Summer Break!

## English




We complete our learning surrounding our fantastic text, Shackleton's Journey. This follows the Story of explorer Ernest Shackleton's infamous expedition to Antarctica in 1914.

The book is a fantastic story and will provide wonderful learning opportunities.

### Maths

Our Maths this term focusses on Place value and the four number operations. We will be completing new learning

mixed in with a help of revision in order to get the children working up



to speed early in Term 1. After half term multiplication and division become a huge focus.

#### Science

To begin our year, we will be completing a unit on the changing states of materials. This will include learning about the properties of solids,

liquids, and gases and about how materials change



between these states.

## Geography

In Geography this term, we are learning about Antarctica. This will include some Geographical skills and vocabulary such as longitude and latitude, describing physical and human features, looking at why people have not settled there and investigating Shakleton's expedition which links with our English.



## Computing

In computing this term, Year will be tackling the real-life skill of programming. To do this, we will be using Purple mash to learn about

coding. This is a highly child friendly way of teaching what is becoming a life skill.



## Art and DT

This term we will painting so make sure you have a shirt or apron to wear! We are looking at tone and shade and creating still life and landscape

pictures using different tones and shades.



#### RE

We will consider the key question: Are all religions equal?
