Egyptian Theme Day



English

This term we will be basing our writing on the book 'Cinderella of the Nile,' as re-told by Beverley Naidoo.



Maths

Number - Multiplication and Division

Throughout this unit we will be learning how to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number with or without exchange. We will also be dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number.

We will also explore reasoning and scaling problems.



Measurement – length

We will be exploring length throughout this unit, including measuring, adding and subtracting and comparing. We will also be learning about perimeter.

Light

During this unit of work, we will be exploring a range of objectives such as;

Recognise that light is needed in order to see things and dark is the absence of light.

Notice that light is reflected from surfaces.

Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and ways to protect our eyes.

History

Home Learning

- **Spellings** – Spelling home learning continues to be set each week on EdShed. In order to complete their spelling home learning and to practice for their spelling test each Friday, we ask that the children complete a minimum of 4 games each week.
- **Reading** – To encourage reading for pleasure and to support their progress, we ask that the children read as regularly as possible, ideally daily but **at least four times a week**. Please ensure your child records every time they read in their reading record and that an adult signs it off. Reading records continue to be checked on a regular basis (every Friday) and children rewarded with raffle tickets, in class.
- **Maths** – Each week there will be a battle set on Times Table Rockstars for the children to access. It is really vital that children are learning their times tables.

Home learning continues to be an important way of supporting your children's progress and we would like to thank you for your continued support – it makes a huge difference and has a positive impact on your child's learning.
