*Our Critical Question This Term is:*

*'Could the Great Fire of London happen again now in 2025? Why?'*

**English**

In English we will be reading 'The Great Fire of London' by Emma Adams which links perfectly to our history theme and critical question. We will be researching London Landmarks and creating diaries, posters and then our final piece will be a fact file.



**Maths**

In Maths this term, we will begin by continuing our unit about multiplication and division. We will look at the 5 and 10 times tables again, and how to divide by these numbers. We will then move onto measurement. We will be covering different forms of measurement, such as length and height, mass, capacity and temperature. We will look at the best way to measure each, which will involve lots of practical lessons and hands on learning.



**Science**

In Science this term, we will be exploring the topic 'Living Things and their Habitats.' We will look at different animals and where they live and why this might be. A variety of habitats will be explored around the world, looking at different climates and the species which originate there. We will also look at how animals obtain food from their habitats and will begin to study simple food chains, as well as naming different sources of foods.



**History**

This term, we will be continuing to explore the topic 'The Great Fire of London' with our critical question remaining as; '**Could a disaster in London repeat itself?**' This is an exciting topic that will now look into how London was re-built after the fire and how such things can be prevented.



**Computing**

In computing this term, we will begin by reminding ourselves how to stay safe when using the internet. Our main focus this term will be how to create instructions such as direction, angle and turn. We will learn about algorithms and how they work. We will write a simple program and test it out as well as learning how to debug it.



**DT**

In DT this term, children will be making wraps. They will learn to Name the main food groups, identify foods that belong to each group, Describe the taste, feel, smell of a given food and then design 3 different wraps considering flavours.



**RE**

In RE this term, we will be exploring what a prophet is. We will look at key figures in Christian, Muslim, Jewish and Sikh religions and discuss how they are written into stories. We will also explore the Christian celebration of Easter.



**PE**

In indoor PE this term we will be doing out first dance unit. We will begin to learn dance moves which we will then join together to create our own dances, as well as routines in a group. In outdoor PE we will be doing the second unit of 'Attack, Defend and Shoot' where we will be playing different ball games to practise the skills of throwing, catching, attacking and defending.



**PSHE**

In PSHE this term, we will be exploring the topic 'Healthy Me'. We will be looking at how to keep our body healthy and the different food groups but also the importance of how to keep our mind calm, happy and healthy. We will also look at types of medicines we might take to get better.



## PE

Please ensure your child comes to school wearing the correct named PE kit for school.

If your child has shoelaces, please ensure they can tie them independently.

Earrings should not be worn on a PE day.

## Library

We will be visiting the school library to browse and borrow books every week.
