
We will be continuing focusing on our critical question: **What can we learn from the lives of Ancient Egyptian people?**

Maths


Number: Fractions

We will be begin learning about fractions this term. During this unit of work, we will be thinking about what a fraction is, exploring wholes and parts of a whole. We will be focusing on recognising halves, quarters and thirds!



Measure: Mass and capacity

We will also begin exploring mass and capacity, by looking at measuring in grams, kilograms, litres and millilitres.




Science

Forces and Magnets

This term we will be learning about 'Forces and Magnets.'

In this unit of learning we will be exploring how things move on different surfaces, what a magnetic force is and how magnets can attract and repel each other. We will also be carrying out some scientific investigations this term!



History

The Ancient Egyptians



We will be continuing to learn about the Ancient Egyptians this term including;

- To explain the importance of the correct preparation for the afterlife and to sequence the stages of mummification.
- To locate the River Nile on a world map and understand it's importance.
- To mention at least 3 or 4 iconic features of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation.
- To understand there were other major civilisations in the world at the same time as Ancient Egypt and to understand what they all had in common.

Computing

We will firstly complete the **Spreadsheet** unit, then move onto **email**.

Focuses will include-

- To think about the different methods of communication
- Composing emails
- To open and respond to an email.
- To learn how to use email safely
- Attachments
- To add an attachment to an email.



DT

Textiles – Egyptian Collars



In DT this term we will be designing and making Egyptian collars. We will be selecting and cutting fabrics, threading needles, tying knots and sewing cross stitch to decorate or join fabric. We will be decorating our Egyptian collars using applique, beads and ribbon.



RE

In RE our theme this term is 'What happens if we do wrong?'



We will be exploring what happens if we do wrong and investigating who has the authority to decide the consequences of wrong doing. We will learn why forgiveness is important in many religions.

In PE this term, we will be exploring gymnastics indoors and rounders outdoors.


Foxes will be swimming on following dates:

Home Learning

- Spellings – Spelling home learning continues to be set each week on EdShed. We ask that the children complete a minimum of 4 games each week.
