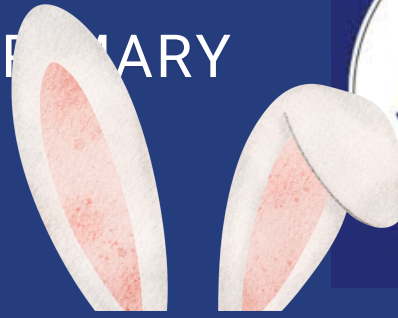

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of what has been a very busy and exciting term, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the many wonderful opportunities the children have taken part in.

Across the school, pupils have embraced a wide range of enriching experiences.

Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed their Great Fire of London workshop, complete with bread-making and the much-anticipated burning of their model houses. We celebrated World Book Day in style, with the whole school dressing as adjectives this year—an imaginative twist that sparked lots of creativity!

Science Day was another highlight, alongside bouncy boots sessions for Years 5 and 6, and bridge-building activities for some of our budding engineers. Remember to be honest when reporting absences, children do tend to tell us where they are going and it's lovely that we can share their excitement.

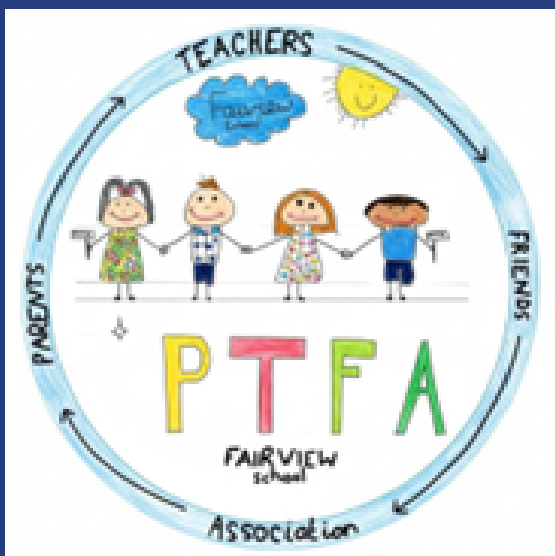

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

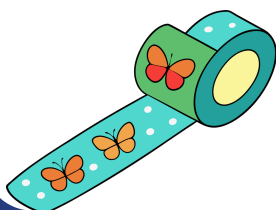
After school clubs for term 5 have now been allocated. If your child has been offered a place and has decided they no longer wish to go, please let us know.

PACKED LUNCHES

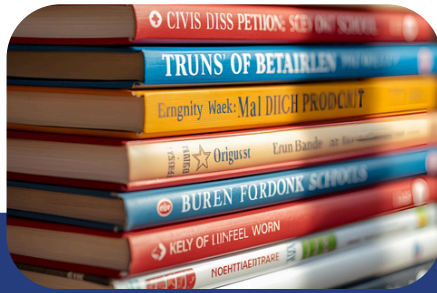
Please can we remind you that children must bring in a healthy packed lunch - NO sweets or chocolate please. Also remembering we are a nut free school.

Evie Guillon in Wolves class (and her mum) will be completing a 'Walk the Night' charity event for the Wisdom Hospice in Rochester.

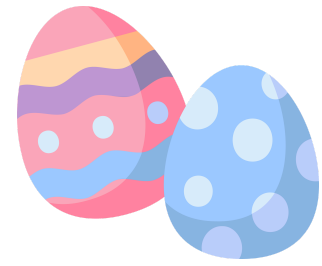
